### **Twiggie Undies in size 10 crochet cotton**

*These fit the 5 ½ to 6 inch bead and dowel dolls*

#### **Materials:**

- Size 10 crochet cotton
- Size 6 steel crochet hook
- ¼ inch buttons

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Gauge: 9sc = 1 inch

### Stitches:

BLO = Back Loop Only

FLO = Fron Loop Only

Rib = two rows of sc worked BLO

Link stitch = (ch3, dc in the third ch from the hook) first link made; (ch3, dc in the third ch from the hook) second link made. Work as many links as called for in the pattern. Each link consists of a ch3 leg and a dc leg. When you work 'in the link' you will be working around one of the legs of the link.

Picot = ch2, sl st in the second ch from the hook.

Note: beginning ch1 and ch2 DO NOT count as the first stitch.

**Side-to-Side-Camisole:** worked from side to side for the main portion of the bodice. This part fits around the torso of the doll. For the neckline/armholes the work is turned so you are working in the rows (ribs) of the bodice.

1: Ch9, sc in the second ch from the hook and each ch across, ch1, turn. 8Sc

2-24: BLO, sc in each sc across, ch1, turn. 8sc. At the end of row 24, ch1, turn the work so you are working across the rows (in the ribs)

**Bottom edge:** work (three sc in the first rib, two sc in the second rib) across. Ch1, 30 sc. Turn so you are working up the side of the bodice. Sl st loosely in the back loop of each st up the side, ch1, turn so you are working across the top of the bodice

Work two sc in each rib across, ch1, turn so you are working back across the top of the bodice. 24Sc

**Neck edge and armhole openings:**

1: In FLO, sc in the first four sc, work three links, skip three sc, sc in the next 10 sc, work three links, skip three sc, sc in the last four sc, ch1, turn.

2: In both loops, sc in the first two sc, sc the next two sc tog. Working in the links, work two sc in each link across, sc next two sc tog, sc in the next six sc, sc the next two sc tog. Workin in the links, work two sc in each link across, sc next two sc tog, sc in the last two sc, ch4. Turn the work so you are working down the side of the camisole.

**Buttonholes:** skip the first two rows. Sl st in the next st, sc in the next five sts, ch3, sc in the last st. Two buttonhole loops made. Turn the work so you are working across the bottom of the camisole.

**Bottom trim:** you can trim the bottom of the camisole with any decorative lacy stitch. For a simple shell stitch [(sc, 2dc) in the first st, skip the next st] across. Finish off.

Sew two ¼ inch buttons opposite the buttonhole loops and you are done!

**Top-Down-Camisole:** this cami is worked from the neck down.

1: Work seven links, ch1, turn.

2: In each link work five sc, ch1, tun. 35 sc

3: Sc in the next five sc, ch4, skip next eight sc, sc in the next nine sc, ch4, skip eight sc, sc in the last five sc, ch1,turn. Armholes made; 19sc, 8 ch

4: Sc in each sc and ch across, ch1, turn. 27 sc

5: Sc in each sc across, ch1, turn. 27 sc

6: Sc in the first nine sc, two sc in the next sc, sc in the next 9 sc, two sc in the next sc, sc in the remaining sc, ch1, trn. 29 sc

7-8: Sc in each sc across, ch1, turn. At the end of row 8, ch4, sl st in the second ch from the hook (first dc, picot made for the next row)

9: BLO, (dc, picot) in each st across. Turn the work so you are working up the side of the camisole and make two ch4 buttonhole loops, one at the waistline and one at the neck edge; slip stitching between the buttonhole loops. Sew buttons opposite and you are done!

You can use these camisole tops as a bodice for a dress or rompers; you could sew a vintage hanky to the bottom edge for a dress or slip, or use a piece of light cotton fabric. You can add ruffles or sleeves to the armhole openings, and a lacy trim to the neck edge, in the same or contrasting colors. You can add contrasting trim to the free loops at the bodice top and bottom edge.



**Pantaloons:** to begin, ch90 tightly and finish off. This is the waistband tie and you will work the first row of sc around this tie. DO NOT work into the chains, work around them. Fold the tie in half and mark a point one inch from the midpoint and begin here with the sc sts

1: Work 34 sc around the waistband tie, ch1, turn. 34 sc

2: Sc in each sc around, ch2, turn. 34 sc

3: Dc in each sc around, join, ch2, do not turn. 34Dc

4-6: Dc in each dc around, join, ch2, do not turn. 34Dc

Leg dividing round:

7: Ch3, skip the next 17dc, sl st in the next dc, ch2, dc in the same st and the next 16dc; work three-dc-decrease on the next three chain and join to the first dc, ch2, do not turn. 18 dc

8: Dc in each dc around, join ch2, do not turn. 18 dc

9: (Dc in the first four sts, dc next two sts tog) around, join, ch1, do not turn. 15Dc

10: BLO sc in each st around, join ch1, do not turn. 15Sc

11: Both loops, sc in each sc around, join, ch4, do not turn. 15Sc

12: BLO (dc, ch1) in each st around, join. Finish off.

If you want to add a second ruffle, join thread in the first unused loop of round 10 and work (dc, ch2) in each st around, join, finish off.

Join thread in the first unworked stitch of round 7 and work the second leg same as the first.
